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### Create a tag for the current wiki

- Push the button to create a tag

### Restore the wiki

- Push the button to restore a tag

### Remove a tag

- Push the button to remove a tag

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Tags: A tag is a mark in the current state of the Wiki. They can be used to save the Wiki at regular intervals and to recover the whole Wiki to a particular state if something disastrous occurred. To create a tag simply enter a tag name and click the **create** tag button. To restore a tag select one of the existing tags and click **restore** (*all your Wiki pages will be lost and the saved state for the wiki will be restored!*). Since tags can take a lot of space you can remove tags that you don't want to use by clicking the **remove** tag button after selecting the tag that you don't want to use anymore.

# Wiki Settings

Wiki Settings - Manage attachment preferences. Enter the number of comments to show at a time. If a page contains more comments, Tiki will create NEXT/PREVIOUS links. (Default = 10)

Comments Default Ordering - Specify how the comments are shown:  
**Points:** Comments with the highest point value are shown first. (Default)  
**Newest First:** The newest comments are shown first.  
**Oldest First:** The oldest comments are shown first.



Field	Description
Default Number of Comments	Enter the number of comments to show at a time. If a page contains more comments, Tiki will create NEXT/PREVIOUS links. (Default = 10)
Comments Default Ordering	Specify how the comments are shown: <b>Points:</b> Comments with the highest point value are shown first. (Default) <b>Newest First:</b> The newest comments are shown first. <b>Oldest First:</b> The oldest comments are shown first.

## Wiki Attachments

Wiki Attachments - Specify if files can be attached to wiki pages. If selected, files that are attached to wiki pages will be converted to BLOBs and stored in the Tiki database in the **tiki\_wiki\_attachments** table. If selected, files that are attached to wiki pages will be stored in the specified directory. The directory can be an absolute path (such as <http://www.foo.bar/attachments/>) or relative to the Tiki installation directory (such as **attachments/**).  
**Note:** The trailing slash (/) is mandatory and *must* be included in the path.



Field	Description
Wiki Attachments	Specify if files can be attached to wiki pages.
Use Database to Store Files	If selected, files that are attached to wiki pages will be converted to BLOBs and stored in the Tiki database in the <b>tiki_wiki_attachments</b> table.
Use a Directory to Store Files	If selected, files that are attached to wiki pages will be stored in the specified directory. The directory can be an absolute path (such as <a href="http://www.foo.bar/attachments/">http://www.foo.bar/attachments/</a> ) or relative to the Tiki installation directory (such as <b>attachments/</b> ).  <b>Note:</b> The trailing slash (/) is mandatory and <i>must</i> be included in the path.
Wiki Attachments	This area lists all current attachments. You can use this area to change an attachments storage location to either Database to File.

# Footnotes

Footnotes are a way to provide additional information or references at the bottom of a page. They are typically indicated by a superscript number in the main text, which corresponds to a footnote in the footer. This helps keep the main text clean and focused while allowing for detailed explanations or citations.

# Users can save to notepad

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# Automonospaced text

Automonospaced text is a feature that ensures all characters in a line of text are spaced evenly. This is useful for creating tables, code blocks, or any text where consistent spacing is important. It prevents the text from being compressed or stretched, making it easier to read and edit.
