

# External Wikis

External Wiki feature is used to make linking to other Tiki, websites topics easier. Using it you will be able to reuse with minimum work a connection (through a link) to your "network" of Tikis and regularly used websites.

## Some examples:

The string on the left are the wikilink or the link shorthand. tw for tiki.org, dev for dev.tiki.org, wq for wikiquote, wd for wiktionary, lq for linuxquestions, wp for wikipedia.

### External wiki and site samples set at Doc

tw [https://tiki.org/\\$page](https://tiki.org/$page) dev [https://dev.tiki.org/\\$page](https://dev.tiki.org/$page) wq [https://en.wikiquote.org/wiki/\\$page](https://en.wikiquote.org/wiki/$page) wd [https://en.wiktionary.org/wiki/\\$page](https://en.wiktionary.org/wiki/$page) lq [https://wiki.linuxquestions.org/wiki/\\$page](https://wiki.linuxquestions.org/wiki/$page) wp [https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/\\$page](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/$page)

## Simple linkage

To make a link to any external wiki or site above on this site you can use the [internal wiki](#) double round brackets syntax with a prefix as "dev:" inside. For instance, to make a link to

<https://dev.tiki.org/Get-code>

you could use:

```
((dev:Get-code))
```

And it would produce this link:

[Get-code](https://dev.tiki.org/Get-code)

## Changing the string displayed

It is possible to use a different string of sentence that the page name to create a more descriptive link. Following the example above we want to improve the information the visitor will see. "Get-code" is quite short, "Get-code and join Tiki dev team" is already more explicit.

you could use:

```
((dev:Download|Get-code and join Tiki dev team))
```

And it would produce this link:

[Get-code and join Tiki dev team](#)

## Insert an external wiki reference

You can do that through the link at "Admin > External wikis", that will lead you to **tiki-admin\_external\_wikis.php**:
